1. Totally 476 students responded to student satisfaction survey.
2. The analysis of the survey conducted shows that most of the students (83%) were highly satisfied on the teaching and learning process of the institution.
3. 61% of teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projector, multimedia, etc. while teaching.
4. The survey questions include the parameter like facilities, syllabus, faculty, soft skills, employability skills (69%), evaluation process, course outcomes, community service project short term and long-term internships, student exchange, field visit opportunities, in the college revealed that the students are highly satisfied.
5. 64% of Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities.
6. At the same time the students are appreciated and highly satisfied with the implementation of curriculum which includes communication of teacher with students, teaching methodology, seminar works and it follow up made by the faculty throughout the semester.
7. They also satisfied and acknowledged the effort put by the faculty in promoting and conducting seminars, workshops especially community service projects, internships and hands on training sessions, interdisciplinary learning programmes implemented in the institution since they are very much helpful to them to see world beyond their prescribed curriculum.
8. 83% of students strongly agreed on the overall quality of teaching – learning process in your institution.
9. 68% of students strongly agreed on the faculty participation in identifying strength and weaknesses to strengthen and overcome those respectively
