Key Findings:

1. The majority of students expressed satisfaction with the overall quality of teaching, citing knowledgeable and supportive faculty members who effectively conveyed course material.
2. Students provided mixed feedback regarding the relevance of the curriculum to their academic and career goals. While some praised the practical applicability of coursework, others expressed a desire for more real-world examples and practical experiences.
3. Students identified areas for improvement in support services, particularly in terms of accessibility and responsiveness. Some students reported challenges in accessing academic advising, counselling services, and career guidance resources.
4. Overall satisfaction with campus facilities varied among students. While many appreciated amenities and well-maintained infrastructure, others highlighted issues such as overcrowded study spaces and limited access to technology resources.
5. The survey questions include the parameter like facilities, syllabus, faculty, soft skills, employability skills, evaluation process, course outcomes, community service project, short term and long-term internships, student exchange, field visit opportunities, extracurricular activities and related activities in the college revealed that the students are highly satisfied.

6. At the same time the students are appreciated and highly satisfied with the communication of teacher with students, teaching methodology and follow ups made by the faculty throughout the semester.

7. They also satisfied and acknowledged the effort put by the faculty in conducting students' seminars, community service projects and internships.

8. The majority of students reported a moderate to high level of overall satisfaction with their educational experience.

Recommendations:

1. Review and update curriculum to ensure alignment with industry standards and emerging trends. Incorporate more hands-on learning opportunities and practical experiences to enhance student engagement and relevance.

2. Increase accessibility and availability of support services, including academic advising, psychological counselling, and career guidance. Implement strategies to streamline processes and reduce wait times for students seeking assistance.

3. Address infrastructure challenges and invest in facilities upgrades to meet the growing needs of students. Consider expanding study spaces, upgrading technology resources, and enhancing amenities to improve the overall campus experience.

Conclusion:
